

Why I Joined RWN: When I decided six years ago to dedicate my newly launched coaching business to women, I made the strategic decision to investigate

Rochester Women's Network. I didn't visit RWN because of anything I had heard or experienced about the organization. Based on nothing more than a Google search, I registered for and attended the next recruitment and orientation meeting. I joined that night.

Like many others, I chose RWN primarily for building relationships with other businesswomen. At the time of my first visit, I had a small network. My attitude toward networking was apathetic, at best. That, and my uncertainty about how to get involved in the community, had kept my LinkedIn network barely above double digits.

Shortly after joining RWN, I decided to attend a Summit Business Conference planning meeting. I have chaired or co-chaired the event ever since. I joined the board of directors in my second year as a member. I've also been active in the Marketing, Membership and Community Service Committees. A few years ago, I launched the Success in Giving Special Interest Group (AKA "the SIG SIG"), which continues to be a valuable resource for support and referrals. And while I miss many more programs and free networking events than I would like to, I get to experience enough to keep me feeling connected and inspired.

Everyone's RWN experience is different. For some, professional development is the motivating factor. Others are looking for mentorship, support and camaraderie. My membership started at a time defined by growth. Today, my business has become financially successful. I meet clients and collaborators through RWN. The number of my LinkedIn connections is nearly 1000.

When I make new local acquaintances these days, I often hear that my name or face is familiar. My consistent response is, "Are you a member of of RWN?" I know that chances are we have met at an RWN event, or they have seen me in the media as an RWN representative. Or noticed my byline in the newsletter—often accompanied by my headshot that was taken by Renee Veniskey, an RWN member.

Brightstar Community



The cycle of addiction, prostitution and human trafficking have reached epidemic proportions in the United States. Sadly, this problem is especially severe in the Rochester area. However, there is good news. A program called Thistle Farms, developed in Nashville, TN, which has been helping women trapped in sexual slavery and prostitution for more than twenty years is being brought to Rochester by Sue Kirby, founder and Executive Director of Brightstar Community, a locally based organization using the Thistle Farm model. Brightstar is one of 41 sister organizations to Thistle Farms and a member of the Thistle National Network. Brightstar is working to create a community of healing for victimized women, providing a home where they are safe and can recover from addiction and abuse, learn critical life and vocational skills, and become a healthy, productive member of our society, with skills to not only survive but thrive.

The Brightstar community is reaching out to personally invite you to an important panel discussion addressing the issues of sex-trafficking and prostitution in the Rochester area. Please join the discussion on Saturday, December 16th, from 10:00-11:30 a.m. at the RIT Center for Urban Entrepreneurship (C.U.E.), located at 40 Franklin Street in downtown Rochester. We are pleased to welcome Becca Stevens, the founder of Thistle Farms, to Rochester to share her knowledge on how to bring women back from the streets and help them become productive members of our community.

About Becca Stevens: Becca Stevens is a renowned author, humanitarian, and a CNN Hero of 2016. Her passion project, Thistle Farms, is a Nashville-based program designed to heal, empower, and employ women survivors of trafficking, prostitution, and addiction. Becca's program has become so successful, in fact, that it has become a model and inspiration for similar recovery programs around the country, including Brightstar Community.
