Traci is an active member of the National Association of Women in Construction, Women's Council: A Greater Rochester Chamber of Commerce Affiliate and the Women's Foundation of Genesee Valley. Traci jumps right in to help each cause that she supports, from volunteering on the Young Women of Distinction Selection Committee, spearheading Gilda's Club Hero's Ball, to serving as a University of Rochester Young Entrepreneur's Academy judge, with a goal of teaching and inspiring future female entrepreneurs to follow her lead.

Traci believes in extending this same opportunity to her employees and gives her staff paid time to give back, allowing them to work with local nonprofits on the clock without interfering with their life and family commitments after working hours.

In the last two years, while raising two young children as a single mom, she has grown a successful Certified Woman Business Enterprise (with 100% ownership by a woman) into an industry leader, in a primarily male dominated industry. Simultaneously, she's immersed herself in the community through her professional and civic involvement. I joined the RWN in February of 2016. Although I am a very social person, I had never really embraced the idea of "networking". However, as sales was part of my job at the time, joining a formal networking organization was a requirement. After doing a little research, RWN seemed to fulfill that requirement while allowing me to commit as little or as much time as I wanted.

It was a strange point of my life. I hated my job and the idea of trying to network to sell a product that I didn't stand behind was not appealing. So, I joined and then never attended a single RWN event.

In April of 2016, I was let go from my position. I was told "Lauren, you're a hard worker with a great attitude, but we just don't think that you can sell. And we know that you would never quit, so we're going to let you go." So, on April 15, 2016 I got laid off for the fifth time in my corporate career after previously spending 20+ years as an accountant and about seven as a recruiter. I had no idea what I was going to do next, but I knew I was NEVER going back to Corporate America. I was not going to allow anyone else be in charge of my life, financial security, or destiny.

Fast forward a couple of months...I got an email that Megan Flanagan-Mills was hosting an RWN free networking event at her Farmer's Insurance office.

Normally, I wouldn't have paid attention, but Megan's office is about a minute walk from my house. Why not go and check it out? It turned out to be a great experience! Everyone was friendly and welcoming.

Right around the same time, I had started helping some elderly neighbors and friends with simple tasks to help them with their day-to-day lives. I loved it! The satisfaction of helping people and being appreciated was amazing. I started thinking, "Hmm...I might be on to something here. Lots of people need help...maybe there's a market for this."

In 2017, I decided to take a leap of faith and start my business, Everyday Hands. I made a pledge to myself that I would do everything it takes to be successful...knowing that meant that I'd have to do the "dreaded" networking. So, I began attending the Referral SIG, the Sales/Marketing SIG, and every free networking event. I also scheduled one-on-one meetings with as many members as possible. I couldn't believe how easy it was to make new friends and build relationships. I have met some incredible people through RWN that I would never had met otherwise. These are all extraordinary people! Almost all of my business partners (insurance, financial advisement, marketing, etc.) are a direct result of networking within RWN. Everyday Hands would not be where it is today without the support, knowledge, and encouragement from my friends at the RWN. I believe that truly. Joining RWN has been without a doubt the single best decision I have made for myself and my company.

NOTED AUTHOR DEBBY IRVING TO LEAD DISCUSSIONS ON BUSINESS, LEADERSHIP AND RACE
